### 4. Public Forum

Alice Dvorak: Expresses her opposition for the Elmhurst Extended Care Center (EECC) expansion into the neighborhood on East Fremont Avenue. The expansion will lead to a decrease in property value.

Greg Dvorak: Resident of East Fremont Avenue for fifty years and expresses opposition for the EECC expansion.

Claude Pagacz: Expresses concerns for increasing water bills. Disagrees with the way the council handled the American Legion grant at the last meeting.

John McNichols: Submitted a map of the EECC expansion as a receipt or written communication. Disagrees with the expansion because it does not comply with the comprehensive plan. The expansion calls for the construction of a large building located in his backyard. Encourages EECC to find a better location for their expansion.

Eileen Oeser: Opposes the EECC expansion because it intrudes on a residential area and it does not comply with Elmhurst's comprehensive plan. Also, there is no guarantee that it will accommodate more residents.

Theresa McCarthy: Opposes the EECC expansion because there is not enough space to accommodate the new building. Jacob Dvorak: Opposes the EECC expansion because it does more harm to the neighborhood than it does good.

Jaime Dvorak: Also opposed the EECC expansion because it has no benefit to the community. Encourages the property owner to look at other locations for the expansion.

Rob Goldstein: The EECC expansion impairs resident's quality of life. It does not fit in the area designated for the expansion. It is a commercial enterprise intruding on a residential zone—spot zoning, which is illegal.

- -Pulled by Alderman Bram
- -Development, Planning, & Zoning Committee recommends that the City Council approve the applicant's request for a conditional use permit to add an antenna about fifteen feet to an existing cellular tower. The City Attorney is here by directed to prepare the necessary documents for City Council approval. Signed by Alderman Levin, Alderman Mulliner, and Alderman Honguest.
- -Alderman Levin: A forty-five foot cellular tower will be getting a fifteen foot increase to sixty feet. It is adjacent to the expressway and will not be very noticeable. This report passed unanimously at the commission and committee.
- -Alderman Bram: Cannot support the increase because it neighbors a residential area. When the cellular tower was first brought to the council for approval it was purposely limited to forty-five feet. This is because there were concerns about its height back then. Research says that this is the only antenna neighboring a residential area and the only reason it exists is for Verizon to provide better reception to users on the expressway.
- \*\*6.16 O-39-2017 An Ordinance Approving the First Amendment to the Ambulance Service Contract By and Between Metro Paramedic Service and the City of Elmhurst, Illinois 13 Ayes; 1 Nay: Alderman Bram
- -Alderman Healy: This ordinance is to change the Metro contract to include the ALS chase car, the response unit we approved last meeting. The existing contract goes through September 2018, so there is a year and a half remaining. The ALS vehicle should arrive in June or July and this ordinance would allow the city to include it in the remaining year and a half.
- -Alderman Bram: Expresses his concerns about lack of data on the ALS vehicle. Believes the ALS vehicle is not the right decision because it is more expensive than the ALS fire engine.
